Postal entries should be with me by Friday; emails by 12 noon on the Saturday. All bids should be accompanied by your full and preferred contact details. All emails will be acknowledged as confirmation of bid. After the auction, notification will go out by email and post – telephone confirmation will only be if specifically requested at the time of bidding. And please, when bidding, it is really helpful if you can include with the lot number a brief description of what the lot is.

After the auction ends, all unsold lots are open to offers, within reason. If you would like to discuss offers, after the auction ends, please indicate as such with your bids

Postage rates are 1^{st} class recorded (6" x 6") £6.00. Parcels with a value £100+ will go special delivery at the actual cost (usually between £9 - £12). Large parcels £18.50.

Payment is by cheque preferably, made payable to Mark Alford, but if you wish to pay by bank transfer this information will be made available on an individual basis to the buyer.

SOME COMMON COURTESIES FOR BIDDING IN THE AUCTION

It takes a lot of concentration and organisation to sort the administration of the auction before, during and after the event, and the simplest of mistakes can cause a great deal of upset to its smooth running. As well as unnecessary aggravation! As such I thought it timely to remind members of some of the common courtesies that make life, for the auctioneer, so much easier.

You might inadvertently bid on lot 41, when your intention was for lot 42. But if you win it you pay for it! But if you had bid on "Lot 41 Sheffield" and Lot 41 was Wales – it was lot 42 that was Sheffield – your bid would have been corrected, after checking with you first your intention. You might wright the wrong number, but never the wrong description. So, to avoid any confusion, please DO write the briefest of description against your lot number as support.

After the auction is over, there is SO much to do. One of the simplest ways you can help is by always including your contact details alongside your bids. And this is especially relevant to telephone bidders and/or those who want a telephone call after the auction. The auction ends on Saturday evening (usually). If you have booked a telephone call after the auction, then DO BE IN to receive that call. Making calls and leaving messages over the weekend, with no return call, is nothing short of an abuse of the auctioneer's time!

During the afternoon of the auction, the auctioneer is busy, busy, BUSY! So please, refrain from making any phone calls, unless these have been pre-booked.

If you are away from home, for any reason, after the auction has ended, and therefore are not in a position to make payment immediately, this is not an issue, but again common courtesy should tell you to let the auction secretary know in advance. Related to this is a request that you try to make payment expeditiously, wherever possible.

The auction is now over, the parcels have been posted, and sellers and buyers alike are wondering what they sold or won. The auctioneer has a box of tracking receipts for all those parcels, and is waiting to hear if there are any (hopefully none) delayed, damaged or missing parcels; if the goods have arrived safely; if they are the correct ones; or of any queries that might arise. So, lastly, probably the most helpful note of all – take just a moment to let the auctioneer know that your parcel has arrived safely and that all is good.




